CHIGNON

The word chignon comes from the French “chignon du cou”, which means nape.

The chignon is achieved by gathering the hair in a ponytail and then shaping it into a ball. There are, however, several variants.



STEP BY STEP

CHIGNON

It is a type of hairstyle worn for special occasions, such as weddings or gala events, but the base of the chignon is also used for everyday sports styles.

The first chignons date back to the era of Ancient Greece, where Athenian women commonly wore them, securing them with ivory or gold clasps.



STEP BY STEP

CHIGNON

Also falls into the structured plan type of techniques.

STEP BY STEP

THE CHIGNON

Create a ponytail and twist it counter-clockwise upon itself.

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THE CHIGNON

Place the index and the middle fingers on the base of the ponytail and rotate it clockwise.

STEP BY STEP

THE CHIGNON

Roll it around the base, from right to left (clockwise) while keeping the twisted ponytail close to the base itself.

STEP BY STEP

THE CHIGNON

Rotate the twisted ponytail around the base, from right to left (clockwise).

STEP BY STEP

THE CHIGNON

Keep the ponytail close to the base itself.

STEP BY STEP

THE BACKCOMBED CHIGNON

Create a low placed ponytail and backcomb it.

STEP BY STEP

THE BACKCOMBED CHIGNON

Separate the ponytail into three sections.
Backcomb them lightly and wrap each section around
the tease until it is covered, to completely hide it.

STEP BY STEP

THE BACKCOMBED CHIGNON

Continue to rotate it on itself until you run out of hair.

STEP BY STEP

THE BACKCOMBED CHIGNON

Hide the ends under the created “ball” and secure everything with hairpins by inserting them diagonally with respect to the direction of the hair.



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
