



STEP BY STEP

WEAVES

A weave, commonly called a **plait**, is obtained by overlapping and crossing sections of hair.

It can be 2, 3, 4 or more sections (if it is 2 sections it is usually called a **herringbone** or **wheatsheaf plait**).

Its execution can include the prior construction of a **ponytail**; in this case, because of its left-loose positioning, it is called a "**pig plait**".

It can, on the contrary, be **positioned on the base**, when it is resting at the base.

We speak, instead, of **Dutch plait** when you do a feed by extracting new sections from the hair and putting them in the weave.

STEP BY STEP

FOUR-SECTION WEAVE

Choose the area in which to create the weave.
Select 4 sections of the same thickness.

STEP BY STEP

FOUR-SECTION WEAVE

Start with a three-section weave. Insert the fourth section from the outside.

Continue with a three-section weave, then insert the outermost section.

STEP BY STEP

FOUR-SECTION WEAVE

Shown in these images are two different interpretations of the four-section weave structured on a divided and simple work plan.



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
